

## **STATEWIDE AND REGION COUNTS OF HOMELESS PEOPLE**

### **Hennepin County**

This report provides numbers of homeless people counted or interviewed in Minnesota on October 22, 2009. Counts were provided by shelter and transitional housing providers. Interviews of homeless individuals were conducted in emergency and battered women's shelters, transitional sites, drop-in service locations, and non-shelter locations. This report does not contain estimates of the uncounted or unidentified homeless population.

Geographic breakdowns are provided for the state as a whole, Seven-county Metropolitan Area and Greater Minnesota, and 11 Continuum of Care regions (housing planning areas designated by HUD).
